### NOTES:

- The Obedience Personality Test was given on \_\_\_\_\_ when the puppies were approximately \_\_\_ weeks of age. A stranger to the puppies was used to administer the test. The test was completed in approximately 15 minutes for each puppy.
- The highest score for Obedience is 36 and the lowest score is 12. On each exercise each puppy is also observed for aggressive or submissive behaviors; the maximum combined score for aggressive and submissive behavior is 12.
- On the chart above the color green represents positive behaviors. High scores are good for obedience and low scores are puppies that do not have aggressive and submissive behaviors. However, a puppy with a few aggressive points will be very confident and flashy in the show or obedience ring.
